Central Park Rose Garden Begins testing EarthKind Roses

In the spring of 2010, the RGRC decided to participate in a multi-year trial with eight other northern zone rose gardens working with Texas A&M Agri Life Extension Service to test roses and qualify for them for EarthKindTM status. The EarthKindTM program is designed to identify and test roses which can survive low maintenance & earth friendly practices. These roses must be able to grow in a variety of soils, be pest tolerant, hardy to heat/cold and also be drought tolerant. This is a most unique opportunity for the Central Park rose garden to feature EarthKindTM roses, as well as be involved in this new agricultural technology and testing program.
